Within the letter, in cursive handwriting, she shared how she has participated with her church in the HPC Baby Bottle fundraiser. She lives in a retirement home now, and cannot attend her church. She has however, saved her coins throughout the past year, to "give that money to your baby bottle fund and your projects for HPC, and our needs to date." She went on to say that HPC is a wonderful place for needy people, and "Is needed, to help them find the Lord as their Savior." My heart was so touched, that I contacted the home to speak with her. The HOPE Program is an in-depth "earn while you learn" program, covering topics from pregnancy to parenting; relationships; life-skills; and Bible Study. Clients earn credits each visit, in which they can get baby items, clothing, diapers, etc. from our store.

Each topic has multiple modules which consist of



teaching videos accompanied with worksheets and homework sheets. In June of 2017, C.C. joined the Hope Program and has been very consistent at making her appointments. she learned about basic infant care in our Main Curriculum. Building upon those lessons, C.C. has advanced into the Toddler Curriculum where she is learning about various mile-

Volunteer Profile: Sandy Lewis

I was born and raised in Pontiac. I have 3 older sisters, 1 younger, and 2 older brothers. One of my older sisters died when she was 25 yrs. old. She had an aneurysm in her brain that burst when she had a seizure, she also had epilepsy. My daddy died in 1991, and my mama died in 2016. I was raised in an apostolic church



which my mama was a member of. That's where my Jesus roots began. I was married twice and divorced once. I had a daughter in the first marriage who is now 40yrs old. My second and present marriage was in 1981. We have 2 girls and 2 boys together. My husband also was married before and has a daughter who is 41 yrs old. Together, our oldest is 41 and our youngest, a son, is 12yrs old. I was baptized in water when I was in my 20's, and was baptized in the Holy Spirit 3 years ago. I was diagnosed with breast cancer in 2014. I found out in October, and had a mastectomy in November. I had chemotherapy and radiation, but I will always say I was healed of cancer by our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. The cancer journey was the worst and best time of my life. I say the best because our Savior taught me how to lay at His feet and give Him my everything. I am far from perfect, but I know Who will take all my burdens. Which brings me to HPC, being obedient to our Father in Heaven. I know Jesus has led me here and I'm excited to see the glorious works He will unfold for all of us.

Introducing "Men of Hope"

Men of Hope, is a new addition to our HOPE Program, and it's introduction to the new fathers (boyfriends of our clients) has been well received.

Pastor David Heath from River of Life Outreach in Meadows, has joined with HPC to provide the young men who accompany our clients to their visits, a male mentor to meet with; to learn from; to be encouraged and challenged by; and to simply listen when they need someone to talk to. Many of these young, new father's have not had a father of their own, or a positive male-figure as an example, and now they have a family to raise and provide for.

Along with a male mentor, the Men of Hope Program will provide training materials to build their confidence and ability as new fathers.
